Event information for Essex



Ford RideLondon-Essex, the world's greatest festival of cycling, returns on Sunday 26 May 2024 and we want to help you plan ahead.

About 25,000 riders will start in central London and travel through Essex towns, villages and countryside before returning to the capital on 60-mile and 100-mile routes.

Essex County Council and event organisers London Marathon Events are engaging with residents, communities, and businesses to ensure the event builds on the success of the last two years.

According to research, 98 per cent of Essex residents who attended the 2023 event said they were proud the county was hosting it. Nearly 90 per cent of spectators said the event brought the community closer together, and 80 per cent felt inspired to be more active.

To help make the event safe for everyone, road closures will be required in some areas of Essex and London. This leaflet is designed to help you plan any journeys you may need to make. Further information is available online at ridelondon.co.uk/community-info

Route

The 2024 event will follow the same route as 2023 but with one key change. Due to an unsafe bridge on Broadmead Road, Woodford, the 2024 route will divert from Grange Hill towards Chigwell and on through Buckhurst Hill before joining High Road, Woodford Green.

Additional vehicle crossing points will be available in Chigwell and Buckhurst Hill to facilitate access and exit for drivers. See the map on pages four and five for full details.

Ford RideLondon-Essex is showcasing the county on an international level, increasing tourism opportunities, and inspiring thousands of people to be active.


£1.75 million of funding

Crossing the route

Stewards and volunteers will provide assistance during the event and help you cross the route wherever possible. If you require assistance that is not a 999 emergency during the event, please ask event staff.

Vehicle crossing points

There will be about 30 vehicle crossing points available on the Ford RideLondon-Essex route on Sunday 26 May, allowing drivers to cross the route safely.

Locations of the vehicle crossing points in your area are displayed on the map on pages four and five.

Pedestrian crossing points

Pedestrian crossing points are located along the event route. These will be supervised to help pedestrians cross the road.

Usual crossings may be suspended, but an alternative will be available where it will be easier to cross.

Please be patient during the event and listen to stewards' instructions.

Pavements

Pavements along the route are accessible to members of the public throughout the event.

Care providers and medical appointments

Provision is in place for care providers to make home visits as planned, and all local hospitals will be accessible throughout the event.

Parking restrictions

Parking restrictions will be in place on roads used by the event on Sunday 26 May. If you usually park on a road that will be closed for the event, please move your vehicle the night before. On-street event signs will advise of the specific parking suspension times. Any vehicle left on the route or parked in a suspended parking bay will be relocated.

Major roads and routes

There will be delays to road journeys in parts of Essex on Sunday 26 May, so please plan ahead.

Open as usual

The M11, M25, A12, A120, A130 and A131 are open as usual in Essex on Sunday 26 May.

Closure of cross-county roads

The part-closure of three cross-county roads – the A414, A1060 and Essex Regiment Way (B1008) – will be required on Sunday 26 May. Full details are provided below to help you plan your journeys.

Δ414

The A414 will be closed between junction seven of the M11 to the A414 London Road in Chelmsford from 05:00 to 17:00 on Sunday 26 May.

A1060

On Sunday 26 May, the A1060 will be closed in both directions at Leaden Roding and between Writtle and Chelmsford from 07:00.

The A1060 will reopen at Leaden Roding only, in a westbound direction, at 13:30 for access towards Hatfield Heath and the M11. The A1060 will fully reopen at 15:30.

Travel to London

Please note there will be significant road closures in central and east London, including the A12, which will be closed between the A406 and the A11.
