Rotherhithe



The 43rd annual edition of the London Marathon takes place on Sunday 23 April 2023 and will require road closures and parking restrictions in your area.

Tens of thousands of participants will take on the 26.2-mile course, which starts in Greenwich, travels through Rotherhithe and crosses Tower Bridge before finishing on The Mall in Westminster.

Road closures

So the 2023 TCS London Marathon can go ahead safely, roads will be closed in Rotherhithe from 08:00 to 16:00 on Sunday 23 April.

Parking restrictions

Any vehicles parked on the route will start to be removed at 06:00 on Sunday 23 April. Please assist us by moving your vehicle off the route on the evening of Saturday 22 April. If your vehicle is relocated by event contractors, please visit **trace.london** to find it.

Free secure parking

Bacon's College on Timber Pond Lane will provide free, secure, overnight parking on its premises for use by local residents.

The car park will operate from 16:00 on Saturday 22 April until 18:00 on Sunday 23 April.

Residents can return to the car park on foot at any time while the road closures are in place to collect their vehicles if they need to exit the peninsula.

Vehicle Crossing Points

We've providing drivers in Rotherhithe with four Vehicle Crossing Points so they can cross the route. The crossings at Plough Way and Deal Porters Way will be open until 08:55 and the crossings at Salter Road and Brunel Road will operate until 09:05.

The crossing points will then close to allow 2023 TCS London Marathon participants to pass. They will reopen when it is safe to do so. Please see the map over the page for more details.

South Sea Street

The emergency access gate on South Sea Street will be open to allow entry and exit until 08:55 on Sunday 23 April.
